Breast augmentation is still the most popular cosmetic surgery procedure in the UK

and continues to grow, with demand up 80% from last year

Based on demand in Q4 2014, next year's latest trend treatments look set to be

neck liposuction, lip reduction, Body-Jet liposuction, vaginoplasty and chin implants

Tuesday 30 December 2014 – With Kim Kardashian's 'break the internet' pictures furthering

surgery rumours and Renee Zellweger's dramatic new look, cosmetic surgery has been big

news this year. New statistics from private healthcare search engine, WhatClinic.com, reveal

what cosmetic treatments were hot or not in 2014 and potential trends for 2015.

Enquiries for open rhinoplasty, better known as nose jobs, rose by 1200% in 2014, while

nasal tip surgery saw an increase of 763%. Open rhinoplasty surgery employs a small

bridging incision, which allows the skin to be peeled back and gives easier access to the

surgeon, however, the procedure costs £4,500 on average and requires up to 10 days of

downtime.

This year has seen enquiries for mini facelifts up eleven-fold (1006%) in the past 12 months,

despite a not-so-mini price tag of £5,451. Eye-lift surgery enquiries have increased by 578% -

so too have average prices, up by a fifth (21%) to £2,199, in the past 12 months.

Combating weight issues has been big business in 2014, with a huge increase in enquiries for

mini abdominoplasty (265%), full abdominoplasty (252%) and lipoabdominoplasty (250%). In

the UK alone, 67% of men and 57% of women are either overweight or obese [1] and at risk

of weight related conditions - such as diabetes, heart disease and strokes.

Liposuction is the third most popular surgical treatment in the UK, with fat transfer close

behind in fourth and tummy tucks in seventh place, in terms of enquiries. Despite already

being consistently popular, enquiries for liposuction have risen by 69% in the past 12

months, while fat transfer enquiries are up 166% and tummy tucks up 68%.

Enquiries for muscle implants dropped by 69% in the past 12 months as demand for the

treatment waned. Cheekbone reduction, post-bariatric plastic surgery, bra-line back lift and

closed rhinoplasty enquiries remained static in 2014.

Neck liposuction enquiries have risen by 280% in the final quarter of 2014, while lip

reduction (135%), Body-Jet liposuction (106%), vaginoplasty (113%) and chin implants

(113%) have also seen increasing demand – suggesting they might be serious trends in 2015.

Neck lipo is the process of draining fat specifically from the jaw line area, as this is often one

of the first areas to sag and develop wrinkles. However, this procedure isn't for everyone as

only young skin with a large amount of elasticity can recover from being emptied of its fat.

"Until then we advise anyone considering going under the knife, to find a practitioner who is qualified, experienced and totally transparent about the risks involved. Don't let special offers cloud your judgement, and don't be afraid to ask about qualifications and insurance cover."
